

Buy Back Scheme



Our Buy Back Scheme applies to our student bassoons and aims to give you peace of mind. If you do need to sell your bassoon again, it will be easy and straightforward for you to do so.

Under this scheme, when you buy certain instruments from us, we will buy them back at up to 90% of your purchase price. You can even trade in an instrument bought under this scheme for another instrument at up to 95% of the original purchase price.

Bassoon Returned Within	Buy Back %	Trade In %
1st 3 months	90%	95%
4 to 6 months inclusive	80%	85%
7 to 9 months inclusive	70%	75%
10 to 12 months inclusive	65%	70%
Year 2	60%	65%

The Buy Back Scheme means that you can hand back an instrument when you choose, and it often works out cheaper than renting a bassoon.

Buy Back Scheme Conditions:

- The scheme applies to those bassoons and mini bassoons for sale where the Buy Back icon is displayed.
- The instrument, crook and case must be returned in the same state in which they were sold, allowing for normal wear and tear. Over and above normal wear and tear, the cost of repairing the instrument and accessories to bring them back to the standard they were in when sold shall be deducted from the refunded amount. We will provide a quotation for this work (if necessary) once we have seen the instrument.
- For the above refund schedule, each month is a calendar month from the date the bassoon or mini bassoon is received and the percentage shown is a percentage of the price you paid.
- It applies to personal buyers only.
- It applies to customers in the European Union only
- If an instrument is bought under the AIP scheme, the refunded amount is calculated on the price you paid exclusive of VAT.
- For trade-ins we offer the trade-in percentages shown against instruments we own only and not against instruments sold on commission on behalf of another owner. We may still be willing to offer a trade-in for commission instruments, so please ask.

This scheme is in addition to our terms and conditions of sale and does not affect your statutory rights.
